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1 Summary

Archaeological monitoring and recording was carried out at Marchants, 8 The Street, Rayne in advance of the construction of a new two-storey dwelling. The historic settlement of Rayne is likely medieval in origins and a number of 16th to 18th century listed buildings survive in the vicinity, including Marchants itself. However, no significant archaeological remains were present.

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


Fig 1 Site location with new build shown as dashed blue line, Cart Lodge as green

2 Introduction (Fig 1)

This archive report presents the results of archaeological monitoring at land to the rear of Marchants, 8 The Street, Rayne, Braintree, Essex, which was carried from the 1st to 15th February 2018. The work was commissioned by Alan Reynolds on behalf of Mr and Mrs Kardhordo in advance of the erection of a two-storey dwelling to the rear of the property. The condition also covered the construction of a cart lodge, which is not to be dug for some time and so was not covered during this current work. The monitoring was undertaken by Colchester Archaeological Trust (CAT).

In response to consultation with Essex County Council Place Services (ECCPS), Historic Environment Advisor Teresa O'Connor advised that in order to establish the archaeological implications of this application, the applicant should be required to commission a scheme of archaeological investigation in accordance with the *National Planning Policy Framework* (DCLG 2012).

All archaeological work was carried out in accordance with a *Brief for Archaeological Trial Trench evaluation*, detailing the required archaeological work, written by Teresa O'Connor (ECCPS 2016), and a Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) prepared by CAT in response to the brief and agreed with ECCPS (CAT 2017).

In addition to the brief and WSI, all fieldwork and reporting was done in accordance with English Heritage's *Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (MoRPHE)* (English Heritage 2006), and with *Standards for field archaeology in the East of England* (EAA **14** and **24**). This report mirrors standards and practices contained in the Institute for Archaeologists' *Standard and guidance for archaeological watching brief* (CIfA 2014a) and *Standard and guidance for the collection, documentation, conservation and research of archaeological materials* (CIfA 2014b).

3 Archaeological background

The following archaeological background draws on the Essex Historic Environment Record (EHER) held at Essex County Council, County Hall, Chelmsford, Essex.

The proposed development site lies within the historic settlement of Rayne. It is situated to the rear of a small nucleus within the settlement around a historic green known as The Gore, which is an early medieval term for a triangular piece of ground, so the settlement is likely to be medieval in origin. A number of 16th- to 18th- century listed buildings survive within this settlement along Gore Lane, including Marchants (EHER 27687) which is located at the top of the lane along The Street. Cartographic evidence shows the development area to have been largely undeveloped over the past 200 years apart from the erection of outbuildings at some point c 1920 which appear to be short-lived and most likely associated with the house adjacent to Marchants.

The main road through Rayne follows the route of a Roman Road known as Stane Street for which evidence of a settlement has been found to the west near the A120 junction and to the east where a small Roman town was established.

4 Aims

Archaeological monitoring and recording was undertaken to identify and record any surviving archaeological deposits that existed on the site, to record any such remains, and to identify the need for any further archaeological work.





Fig 2 Results

5 Results (Figs 2-4)

A CAT archaeologist supervised the excavation of the footings for the new dwelling totalling approximately 43.6m² by 0.5-0.6m deep.

These footings cut through three constituent layers. The uppermost layer consists of a modern topsoil (L1, c 0.17m thick, dark-mid brown clayey-silt with occasional flecks of modern CBM and sub rounded-angular stones). The very upper extent of this soil had been disturbed by the construction work. This overlaid a sterile subsoil (L2 c 0.36m thick, mid brown, silty-clay with occasional rounded stones). This in turn overlaid the natural sands and ballast (L3 natural sand/ballast, light-mid yellowish orange with frequent medium-small stones).

No significant archaeological remains were present.

6 Finds

No finds of archaeological significance were recovered.

7 Conclusion

Despite the potential for historical deposits no significant archaeological features or horizons were identified within trenches excavated for the development.

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






Fig 3 Representative sections
