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1 Summary

An archaeological evaluation (two trial-trenches) was carried out on land at 2 The Paddocks, Stock, Essex in advance of the construction of two new dwellings. Despite being located in an area of archaeological interest relating to the 16th- to 19th-century pottery industry, there were no significant archaeological remains.

2 Introduction (Fig 1)

This is the archive report for an archaeological evaluation by trial-trenching at 2 The Paddocks, Stock, Essex which was carried out on 25th May 2018. The work was commissioned by Bill Wright of Silverswan Homes in advance of the construction of two new dwellings and was carried out by Colchester Archaeological Trust (CAT).

In response to consultation with Essex County Council Place Services (ECCPS), Historic Environment Advisor Alison Bennett advised that, in order to establish the archaeological implications of this application, the applicant should be required to commission a scheme of archaeological investigation in accordance with the *National Planning Policy Framework* (DCLG 2012).

All archaeological work was carried out in accordance with a *Brief for archaeological trial-trenching*, detailing the required archaeological work, written by Alison Bennett (ECCPS 2018), and a Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) prepared by CAT in response to the brief and agreed with ECCPS (CAT 2018).

In addition to the brief and WSI, all fieldwork and reporting was done in accordance with English Heritage's *Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment* (*MoRPHE*) (English Heritage 2006), and with *Standards for field archaeology in the East of England* (EAA **14** and **24**). This report mirrors standards and practices contained in the Institute for Archaeologists' *Standard and guidance for archaeological field evaluation* (CIfA 2014a) and *Standard and guidance for the collection, documentation, conservation and research of archaeological materials* (CIfA 2014b).

3 Archaeological background

The following archaeological background draws on the Essex Historic Environment Record (EHER) held at Essex County Council, County Hall, Chelmsford, Essex.

The EHER shows that the development sites lies within an area of archaeological potential.

Evidence of early occupation at stock comes from an area *c* 300m south-west of the development site and includes a possible Iron Age enclosure (EHER 9135) and a probable Roman cremation cemetery (EHER 5380). A Late Bronze Age/Early Iron Age gully was identified during archaeological monitoring (EHER 46565) *c* 300m to the south-east.

In the later period, pottery manufacture was an important industry in Stock from the 16th to the 19th centuries. Evidence for this industry has come from the east of the development site around Stock Common (which was dug for clay for pottery manufacture). A brick and tile kiln was found immediately to the north at Stock Bowling Club (EHER 5507) and to the south-east at 10 The Paddock (EHER 48334), and near to the junction of Common Road and Mill Road (EHER 5391) evidence of kilns and large quantities of post-medieval pottery were discovered.

For further details of the history of Stock see Phillips (2003).

4 Aim

Primarily, archaeological evaluation was carried out at this site in order to ascertain its relationship, if any, to the historic pottery industry of Stock. More generally, this investigation sought to determine the extent of any surviving archaeological deposits that may exist on site.




Fig 2 Evaluation results (modern disturbance in grey).

5 **Results** (Figs 2-3)

Two trial-trenches totalling 40m were machine excavated under the supervision of a CAT archaeologist.

Both trenches were excavated through modern debris/make-up associated with the demolition of the former property (L1, c 0.41-0.5m thick, medium grey/brown sandy-silty-clay with frequent modern debris) straight onto natural clay (L2).

There were no significant archaeological remains in either trench.

There were no archaeological finds.

7 Conclusion

Despite being located within an area of archaeological interest, the evaluation revealed no significant archaeological remains. It is possible, however, that archaeological deposits had been truncated by modern activity associated with the demolition of the previous property.

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

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


Fig 3 Representative section.
