1 Summary

An archaeological evaluation (two trial-trenches) was carried out on land at Clacton County High School, Walton Road, Clacton-on-Sea, Essex, in advance of the construction of a new teaching block and sports hall. There were no significant archaeological remains.




Fig 1 Site location and trench layout in relation to proposed development (dashed blue).

2 Introduction (Fig 1)

This is the report for an archaeological evaluation by trial-trenching on land at Clacton County High School, Walton Road, Clacton-on-Sea, Essex which was carried out on 1st and 2nd March 2021. The work was commissioned by Matthew Mackenzie on behalf of Morgan Sindall in advance of the construction of a new teaching block and sports hall, together with associated access, services and landscaping. The evaluation was undertaken by Colchester Archaeological Trust (CAT).

In response to consultation with Essex County Council Place Services (ECCPS), Historic Environment Advisor Teresa O'Connor advised that in order to establish the archaeological implications of this application, the applicant should be required to commission a scheme of archaeological investigation in accordance with the *National Planning Policy Framework* (MHCLG 2019).

All archaeological work was carried out in accordance with a brief *Programme of archaeological evaluation on land at Clacton County High School*, detailing the required archaeological work, written by Teresa O'Connor (ECCPS 2021), and a written scheme of investigation (WSI) prepared by CAT in response to the brief and agreed with ECCPS (CAT 2021).

In addition to the brief and WSI, all fieldwork and reporting was done in accordance with *Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (MoRPHE)* (Historic England 2015), and with *Standards for field archaeology in the East of England* (EAA **14** and **24**). This report mirrors standards and practices contained in the Institute for Archaeologists' *Standard and guidance for archaeological field evaluation* (CIfA 2014a) and *Standard and guidance for the collection, documentation, conservation and research of archaeological materials* (CIfA 2014b).

3 Archaeological background

The following archaeological includes extracts of the ECC brief and the Essex Historic Environment Records (EHER) held at Essex County Council, County Hall, Chelmsford, Essex (accessed via <u>http://www.heritagegateway.org.uk)</u>

Little archaeological investigation has been undertaken within the immediate vicinity of the school, although the location would have been a preferred site for settlement and activity since the prehistoric period, lying as it does close to the sea and the former Gunfleet estuary. In the area around Clacton generally, archaeological evidence has been found dating back as far as the Palaeolithic.

The 12th-century church of St Johns (EHER 2846) lies approximately 910m to the north-west, and would have presumably served as the focal point for medieval settlement at Clacton.

4 Aim

The aim of the archaeological evaluation was to record the extent of any surviving archaeological deposits, and to assess the archaeological potential of the site to allow the ECCHEA to determine if further investigation is required.




Fig 2 Results

5 **Results** (Figs 2-3)

Two trial-trenches, both 18m long by 1.8m wide, were machine-excavated under the supervision of a CAT archaeologist within the footprint of the proposed new building.

The trenches were cut through modern topsoil (L1, *c* 0.19-0.32m thick, dark grey/black sandy silt) and layers of accumulation (L2, *c* 0.2-0.25m thick, dark grey/brown sandy silt) and subsoil (L3, *c* 0.13-0.17m thick, light/medium brown silt) onto natural clay (L4, encountered at a depth of *c* 0.55-0.6m below current ground level).

The only features recorded were concrete posts, land drains and a natural feature.

Trench 1 (T1): Two modern concrete posts (part of the school sports pitch) and two land drains. **Trench 2 (T2):** An irregular natural feature (F1) and two land drains.

6 Finds

Two fragments of Roman ceramic building material (435g) and a piece of modern glass (55g) came from the topsoil L1 (1). The finds have been discarded.

7 Conclusion

There were no features of archaeological significance within the evaluation trenches.

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


Fig 3 Feature and representative sections.
