Nature of the work

Observation of groundworks for a two-storey rear extension and soakaway.

Reason for condition

A planning application (211298) was submitted to Colchester Borough Council (now Colchester City Council) in April 2021 for a two-storey rear extension. As the site lies within an area highlighted by the Colchester Historic Environment Record as having a high potential for archaeological deposits, a programme of archaeological monitoring was recommended by the Colchester Borough Council Archaeological Advisor. Significantly the development site is located in an area of Late Iron Age and Roman burials, with the Lexden Tumulus (MCC1356) 385m to the south-south-east. The Lexden Dyke (MCC2099) is also only 90m to the west.

Results

The following groundworks were monitored by a CAT archaeologist in response to a brief set by Dr Simon Wood of Colchester Borough Council Place and Client Services. The WSI was written by Emma Holloway of CAT.

Approximately 20m of foundation trenching was machine excavated under archaeological supervision. The trenching ranged between 0.72m to 0.75m wide and was c 0.9m deep. A 2m by 2m soakaway was also excavated to a depth of 1.3m.

Three horizons were observed consistently throughout:

- modern topsoil (L1, soft moist dark grey/brown sandy silt with brick flecks and inclusions of: stone 20% c 0.3m to 0.35m thick) overlaid
- an undulating subsoil (L2, friable moist medium brown sandy silt c 0.05m to 0.18m), seen predominately to the north and west of the site, which sealed
- soft brown-orange natural sandy gravel (L3, from c 0.5m below current ground level).

There were no significant archaeological remains. Probable tree-throw F1 was identified in section on the eastern edge of the foundation trench. A ceramic drainage pipe, lead water pipe and main electricity cable also cut east/west across the site.

Finds recovered from topsoil (L1) are listed below and have been discarded:

- three fragments (102g) of modern brick,
- five sherds (231g) of modern china and flower pots,
- two fragments (47g) modern glass,
- two pieces (5g) of modern plastic fittings,
- one sherd of Roman pottery (30g).




Fig 1 Site location.




Fig 2 Results.




Fig 3 Feature and representative sections.
